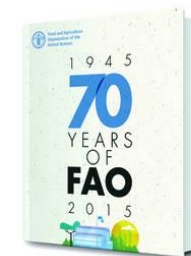

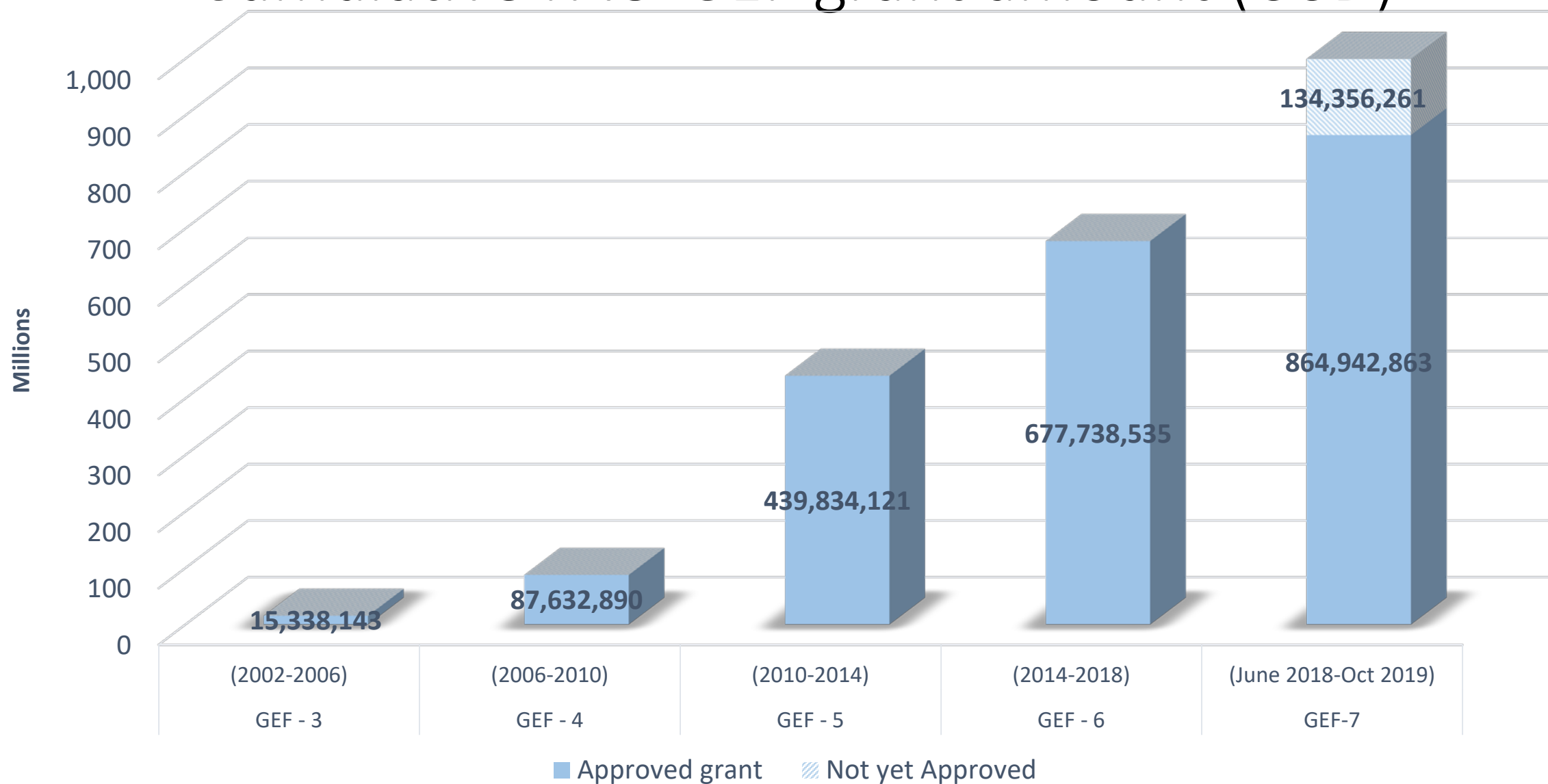

History of FAO in GEF

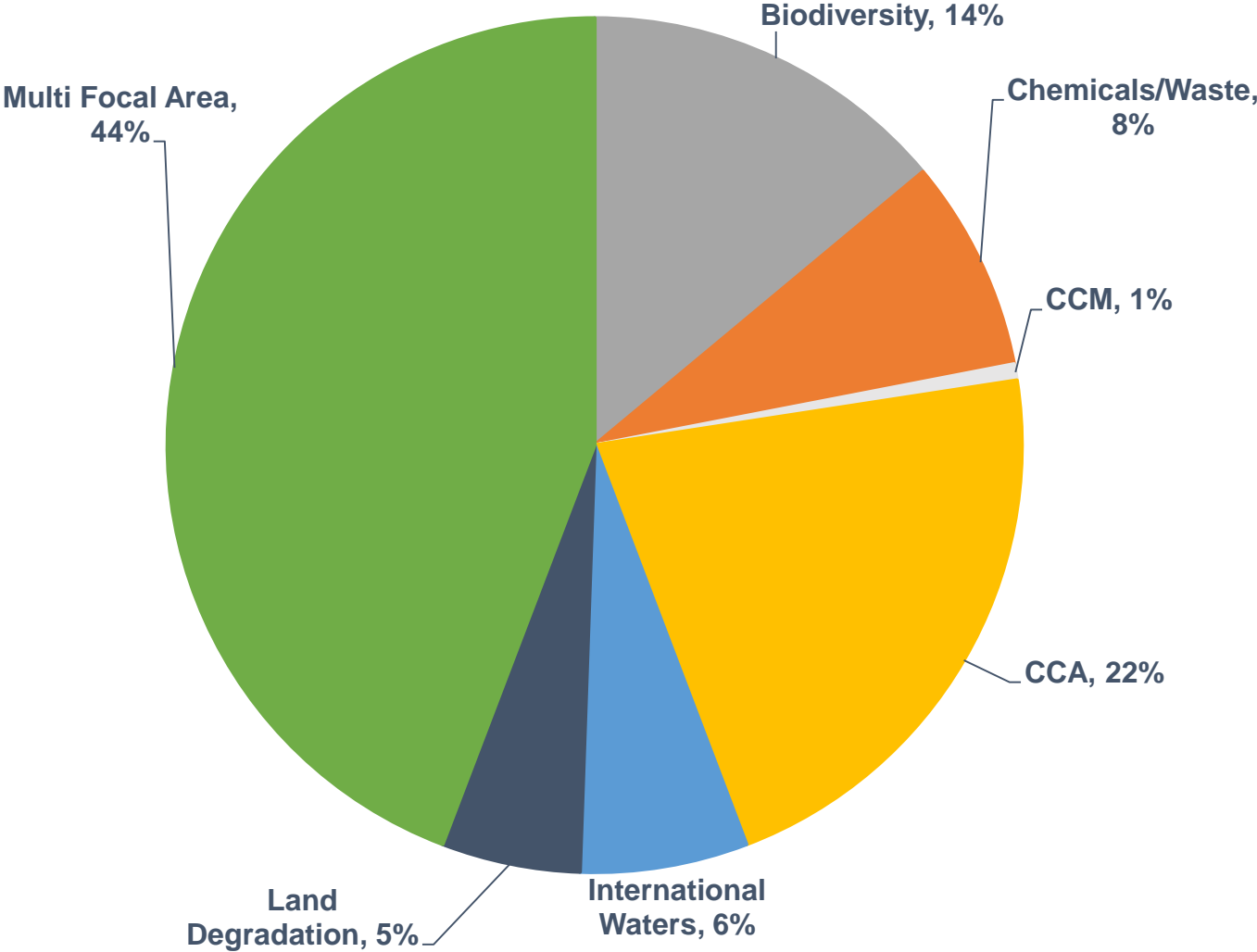
- 1992: FAO started executing GEF projects with “indirect access” for UNDP and UNEP
- 2000: FAO is granted “direct access” for projects in the Chemicals/Persistent Organic Pollutants (POPs) Focal Area
- 2006: Direct access in all Focal Areas

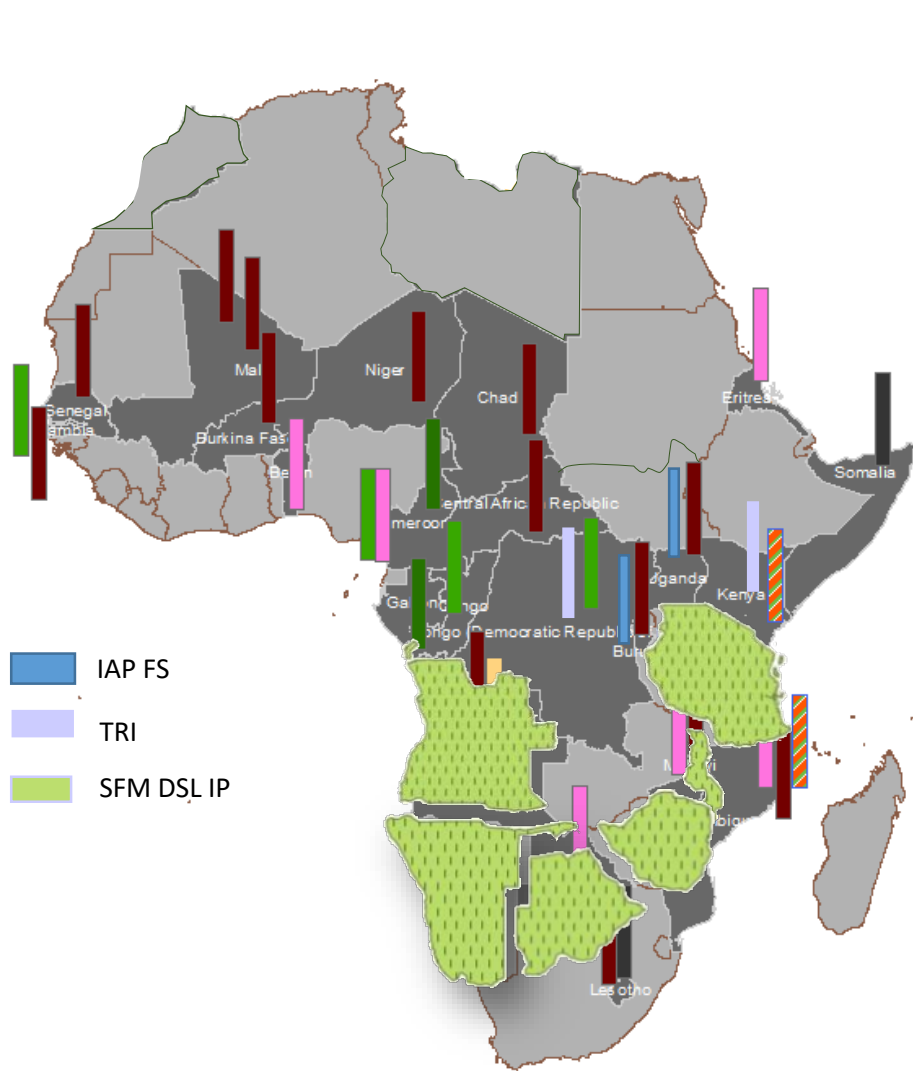

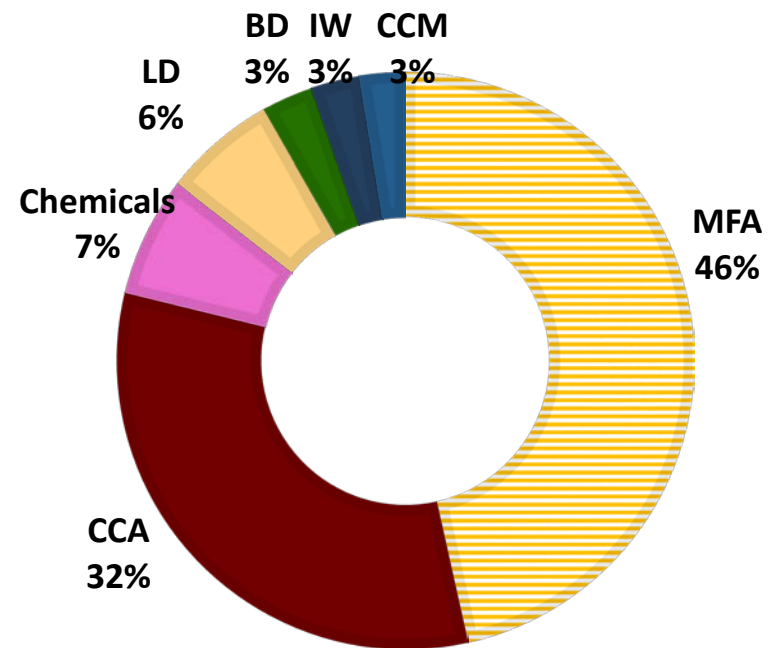

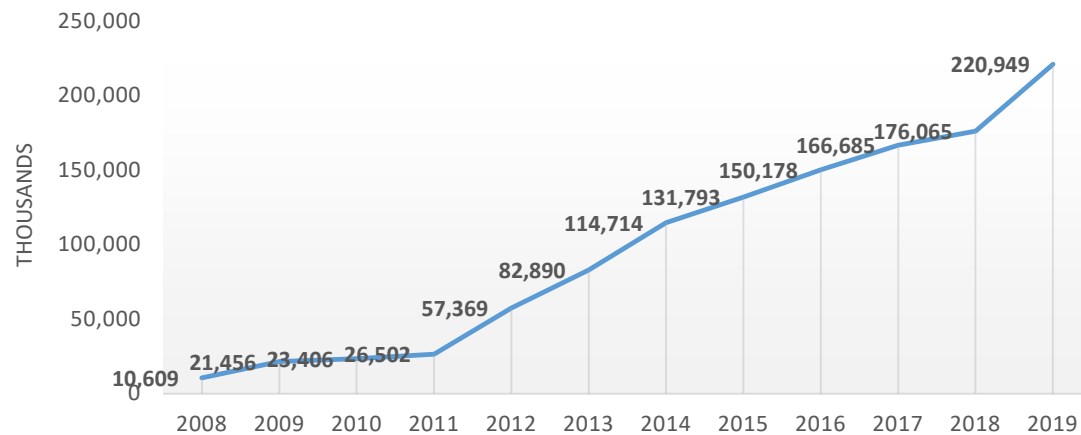
FAO GEF project portfolio Africa – a snapshot¹

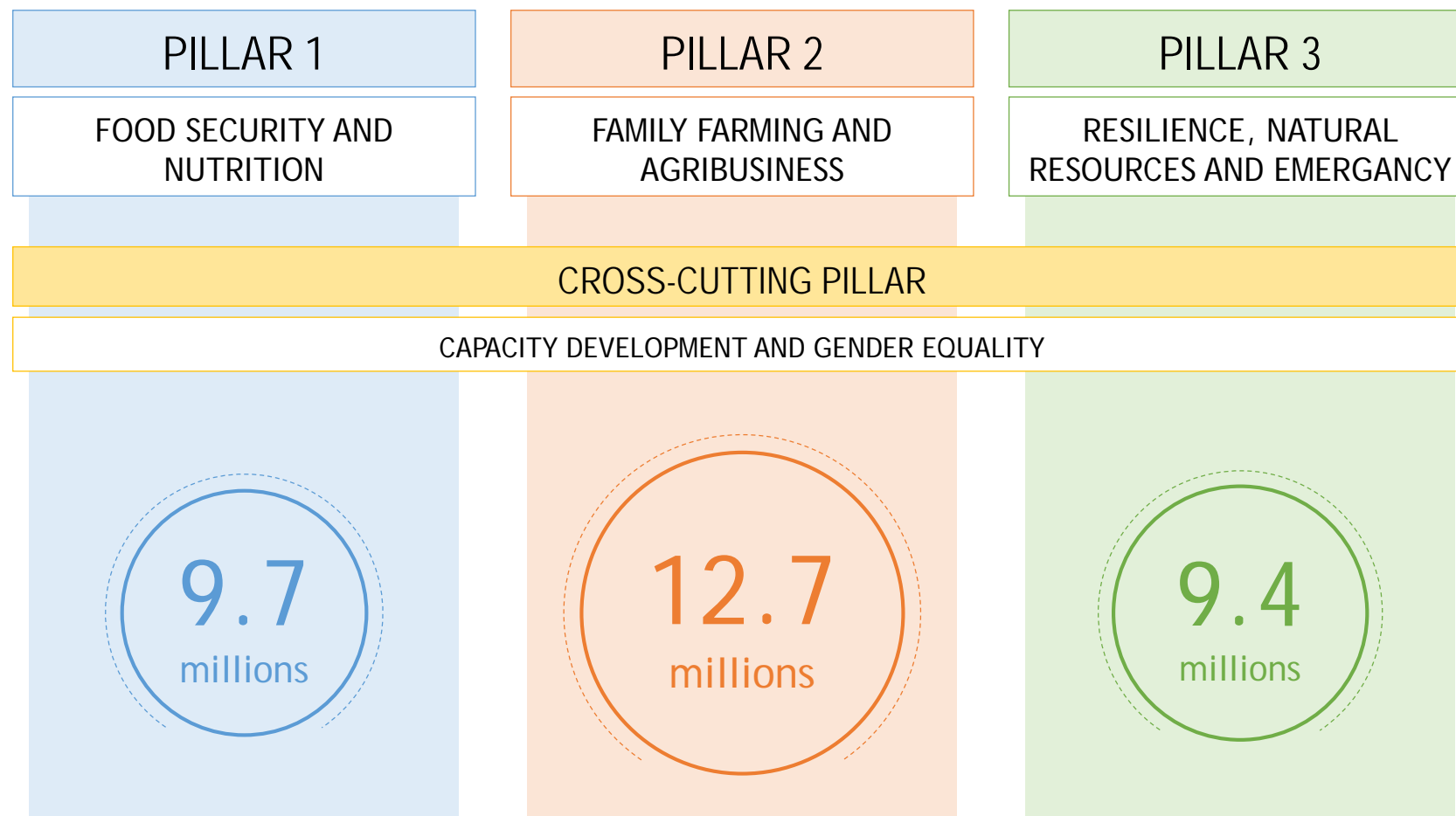

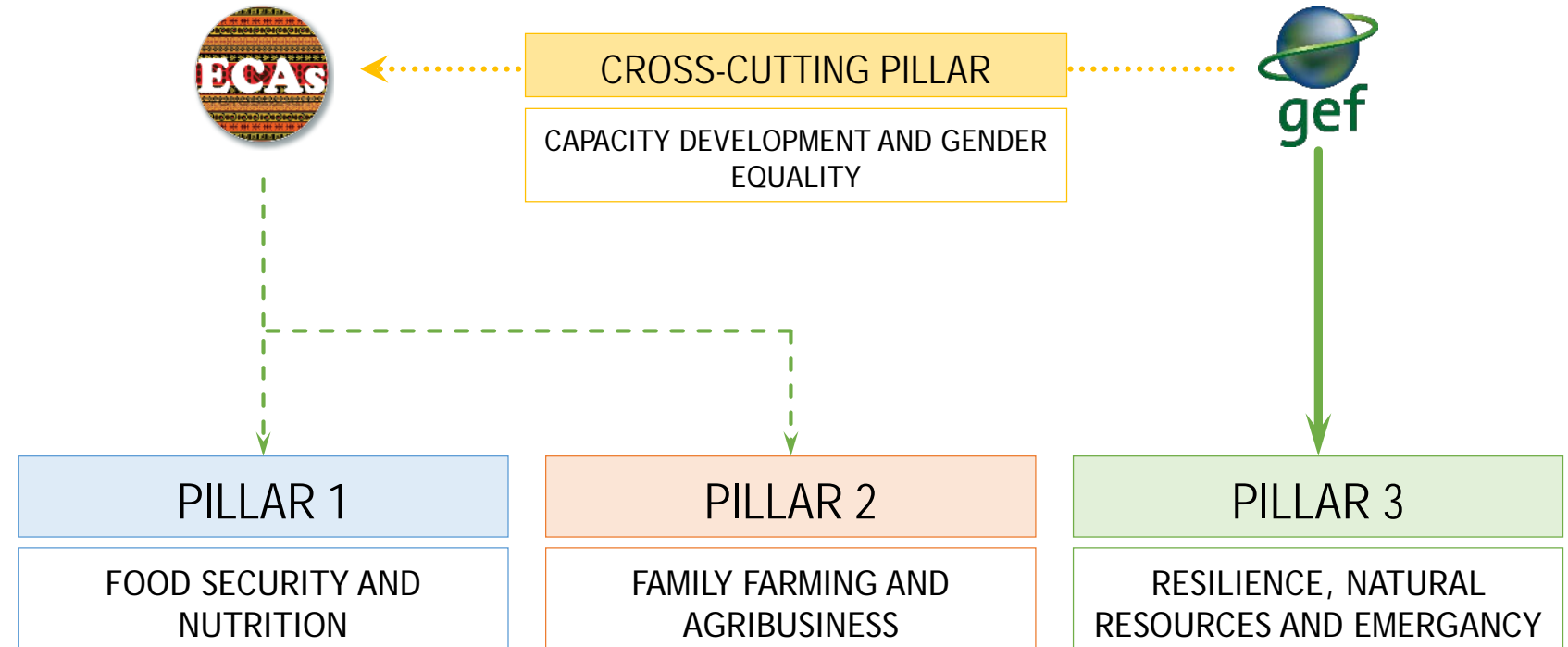
